1. Call to order

4. Approval of the December 8, 2022 Regular Meeting action minutes

- The December 8, 2022 Regular Meeting was cancelled. No minutes to approve.

5. Action Items

5.1 Election of Committee Chair for the 2023 Calendar Year

- Council Member Mourra made a motion that he be chair for the 2023 calendar year. Council Member Priforce seconded the motion. Motion approved.

6. Information Items

6.1 Alameda County Fire Department Report

- Chief West presented the Fire Department calls for service for December 2022 and January 2023.
- Council Member Priforce asked about any increases in medical calls due to an aging population.

6.2 Police Department Crime Stats and Crime Prevention Efforts

- Captain Collins reviewed a summary of the crime statistics for December 2022 and January 2023.
- Council Member Mourra asked follow up questions about the relationship between USPS Postal Inspectors and the Police Department and various types of burglaries. Council Member Priforce talked about mail theft prevention and asked to have further discussion on mail theft prevention at a future meeting.
- Council Member Mourra asked about alarm calls at ECCL. Council Member Priforce asked about the relationship between the school district and the police department. The school incidents report will continue to be included in the monthly crime statistics.
- Council Member Priforce requested additional reporting statistics on juvenile crimes including ages, court proceedings and dispositions if available.

6.3 Police Department Overtime Report

- Captain Collins reviewed a summary of the overtime report for December 2022 and January 2023.
- Council Member Mourra asked about police staffing levels and its impact on overtime.
- Council Member Priforce asked Chief West about fire department staffing levels.
